#### Maple Grove Reopening Guidelines

Sunday worship service starts at 10:00 a.m. There is no Sunday School or Nursery this Sunday. Maple Grove is following the statewide mask mandate, which includes wearing a mask during the church service. Masks are required when in the church building. Disposable masks are available for those who do not have a mask. If you are uncomfortable with following the reopening guidelines, please follow us online until further relaxations are approved.

## Sunday School Restart Plans



The Reopening Committee is happy to announce that we will be restarting our adult and children's Sunday School classes on September 13<sup>th</sup>. Sunday School will be at 9:30 with the worship service at 10:30 a.m.

There are a few procedures we will be doing in order to try and keep everyone safe and healthy. First of all, we will set up Sunday School classes to keep people socially distanced. As has been the case for the past month, we will ask everyone to continue to wear a face covering as well. In all adult and children's classes, we will provide hand sanitizer. We ask that attendees wash hands or use hand sanitizer when entering or leaving class. Additionally, we want to help eliminate crowded hallways. Adults will be dismissed from their Sunday School classes 15 minutes before the worship service so they can be seated in the sanctuary prior to the release of students. Children in grades PK-12 will be dismissed 10 minutes before the service to join their families in the sanctuary. We will continue to monitor the situation throughout the year and make adjustments as needed.
