Climate Ride seeks to Raise Awareness on Climate Change

The Center for Sustainable Climate Solutions (CSCS) is leading a cross-country bike ride to raise awareness regarding climate change and related issues, as well as to learn and to connect with people along the way. CSCS is a collaborative initiative of Goshen College, Eastern Mennonite University, and Mennonite Central Committee.

- The Climate Ride started in Seattle May 31 and will take about two months, ending in Washington, D.C. Sixteen young adult riders plan to complete the entire ride.
- There are opportunities to sign up to join the riders for a day, including one day in Ohio.
- Several virtual and in-person "community townhall" meetings are planned, including a meeting in Millersburg, Ohio, on Tuesday, July 20. That meeting will feature a conversation with Amish author David Kline on the topic "Living with the Land: Food and Climate."
