Sermon Series for February - "Listening to Their Voices"

February is Black History Month, a time when we take particular care and thought to celebrate and recognize black peoples throughout American History, both past and present - who they were, what they accomplished, and what we might learn from them. We recognize that we are a majority white congregation in a majority white area. Perhaps it can feel strange for us to recognize Black History Month. Recognizing Black History Month is important for it helps us more deeply understand our sisters and brothers in Christ who are different from us. This difference is not wrong and should not be diminished but rather celebrated and learned from.

All people are made in the image of God and without engaging the myriad of perspectives of humanity, our understanding of the Imago Dei (Image of God) will be limited. It is in celebrating and learning from our sisters and brothers of color that we come to know more profoundly who God is. It is not just for their sake that we do this work but for our own sake, for in Listening to Their Voices we come to understand ourselves more completely as well.

The point of this series is for us to hear from Black voices. The focus will not be racism or race relations but rather hearing from authors and theologians about a variety of subjects regarding Scripture, Jesus Christ, and our faith lives together.
