My Coins Count raises money for water projects sponsored by MCC to help provide clean drinking water and new wells for communities all over the world. Water is necessary for life! People will not survive if they go more than three days without water.

- ✤ MCC works around the world to help people dig wells and find sources of clean water.
- ✤ MCC builds latrines and provides water filtration systems in places like Haiti and Nigeria in order to help prevent disease.
- ✤ In India, MCC creates irrigation systems that bring water from hills down to villages.
- ✤ In Jordan, MCC installs water collection tanks and gardens at schools in order to improve the learning environment.

Opportunity for Service: Many people are needed to volunteer for many things for the Relief Sale!!! Pam Blough is coordinating some of the volunteer opportunities in our community and below are several opportunities for you to consider. Sign-up sheets are on the bulletin board at the church.

- Prepare and/or roll egg rolls: Last year, egg rolls brought in a little under \$9,000! The Hartville Kitchen has graciously given us the use of their facility to prepare the filling and roll the egg rolls. Kindly consider giving some of your time on Wednesday, August 3, to help prepare the filling (8am-2pm) or Thursday, August 4, to roll the egg rolls (8am-4pm). The more people we have – Thursday is the big day for rolling – the better it will be!
- 2. <u>Egg roll stand</u>: During the sale, egg rolls will be served on Friday evening from 4-8pm and on Saturday from 10am-2pm. We will need 4 volunteers for both four-hour shifts, or 8 volunteers for 2-hour shifts.
- 3. <u>Assist the people who are grilling chicken</u>: People are needed to help the chicken griller (helping to turn the racks, etc.). Volunteers will be needed at the Fairgrounds to help on Friday from 1-6pm and Saturday from 8am-2pm.
