I am sure many of us have heard the expression "a watched pot never boils." And while not literally true it does speak to something many of us, perhaps all of us, have experienced in one way or another. These moments of anticipation, whether staring at the clock counting the moments until the school bell rings, constantly checking our phone while expecting a reply, or counting the days until an upcoming trip. The season of Advent is a time of waiting; this waiting is a practice of remembering the time the world waited for the Messiah to be born, as well as embracing the reality that we today presently wait for Jesus' return. What will Jesus' return bring and what does, or should, waiting for this look like?

Our theme for Advent this year is Restoration is Near. It is an invitation for us to embrace a kind of waiting that lives and moves rather than passively watching the metaphorical pot. Jesus came as Salvation and salvation is all things being restored. This means for us, that our waiting should look like restoration! This Advent season let us embrace the restoration found in Jesus and live out that restoration in our daily lives so that we might wait in faith and hope!

December 25: <u>Christmas Day – Sing for Joy: Your God Reigns</u>

The long-anticipated restoration is here and now. The same Holy Spirit that birthed Jesus

is available to us. This is how a small baby can be good news for today's world.

The tapestry at the front represents our theme of Restoration as a process of assembling and bringing different pieces together as they should be to create a beautiful whole. Each week we will be adding a ribbon until the tapestry is complete.
