Advent Season begins this Sunday.

I am sure most of us who have ridden in a car with children have heard the infamous question, "Are we there yet?". This question often stems from multiple factors: Excitement for the destination, boredom of their present situations buckled in a car seat, a tenuous grasp on the concept of time or some precarious combination of hunger and tiredness. Regardless of the originating factor, the question expresses a longing for that which is not yet realized while addressing the present reality. As adults, however, fielding the "Are we there yet?" question is typically not as romantic as the previous sentence makes it out to be. Maybe because we ourselves are hungry and tired or, more likely, because we have answered that question a dozen times in the last 20 minutes. Are we there yet? Are we there yet? Are we there yet? It is much easier to dismiss this question, to ignore it, to find any distractions to divert their attention away from it. Questions can be frustrating, difficult, and can make us uncomfortable for one reason or another.

Our theme for Advent this year, brought to us by the Leader Magazine, is "How Will We Know?" Advent is a season of waiting. It reflects the waiting ancient persons practiced as they waited for Messiah and our own waiting, as we wait for the return of Jesus. From waiting can emerge questions perhaps like a child squirming in a car seat. We might imagine ourselves as children in the car seats of life crying out to God: How long must we wait for Jesus' return? What should we do as we wait? What is next for us in this waiting? Are we there yet!?!

In the Church it can be easier to dismiss or ignore questions, whether about faith practice, tradition, theology, belief, or any number of life's complexities. Questions such as these can be challenging because, if we are really honest with ourselves, we don't fully know the answers. Though ignoring such questions can often leave the persons who ask them feeling dismissed, unimportant, or alone. Our Advent theme invites us to sit with questions, to ponder, to puzzle, to probe, to perplex. In this we are invited to avoid the trap of rushing to answers; even when these questions are challenging or uncomfortable or annoying. And even when we think we know the answer. Our Divine Parent longs to hear our questions. Cherishing them with limitless patience and love. This Advent theme is one of wondering in the question "How Will We Know?" as it applies to the movements which emerge in this season and in life in general.
