GOOD NEWS: Our sponsorship of the refugee family was approved!!! Next is getting travel authorization from Customs and Border Patrol (usually only takes a couple of days). After approval, their flights can be booked - the travel costs are much less if we can book a few weeks in advance so they will most likely be here early to mid-August. It would be ideal if 7-year-old Vlad could start the school year with his classmates.

Their townhouse is coming together nicely, with furniture and furnishings. Thanks to Holly Miller and Lois Bontrager who worked putting the townhouse together - getting items, assembling furniture, hanging curtains, making it feel more like a home. Thanks to all of you who donated household items; we'll be checking to see what we're missing and let you know if we need more help.

The Fundraising Committee has set a goal to raise \$25,000 as a starting point. Over half of this dollar amount is scheduled to be used to purchase a reliable car for the family. If anyone has a reliable vehicle that they would be interested in donating to this cause, please contact Steve Miller.


Join us Sunday mornings before Sunday School – Everyone is welcome!
